




Parent/Carer Survey Feedback Autumn 2023

We value our relationships with parents and carers and the feedback that we receive, and our annual parent/carer survey is one of the ways in which we hear your voice. We will use this information to consider how we can continually improve what we offer all children across our school. Thank you to the 104 families who responded to the survey giving us feedback from 35.3% of our school community. We have made some comparisons to our parent survey from the 2022/23 academic year however, this was not possible for all questions as these vary from survey to survey.


"My son loves to learn and really likes his teacher, he is so happy in Year 6"

The school's ethos and culture have a positive effect on my child



My child feels safe at school





The school encourages its children to be respectful and caring




This is an increase of 12% on last year. We are delighted that our Christian Values and school culture are impacting on the children in a way that is visible to our parent community.

The school ensures its children are well behaved





"The school has good policies in place to help with bullying"


The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year



We achieve this through our Year group half termly curriculum information which is shared on our website. In addition, we share our learning through social media and our weekly school newsletter.




When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with in line with our Complaints Policy



We have noticed a 16% increase in the number of families who haven't raised a concern and a 24% increase in the percentage of parents who feel that issues raised have been dealt with effectively. This shows that the majority of our parents haven't needed to raise a concern and 75% of those who have were happy with the process and outcomes. We will continue to work with families and, inline with policy, improve outcomes in this area.


Only 11 families answered this question and we are working hard to improve our

The school has high expectations for my child



My child is flourishing at school



"Since starting Reception she has loved coming into school, she has found a love of learning and is supported with her work."


The school lets me know how my child is doing

My child has access to the full range of national curriculum subjects





"My child has been on lots of educational trips, taken part in lots of fundraising events and is part of the school choir."



However, parents were clear that we could develop our range of extra-curricular after school clubs. This will be a priority for us moving forward.



An increase of 9% from our 2022/23 survey.
